Walk with the People Not the Big Polluters

Be part of this year's slightly different walk against warming in one of three key electorates in the lead up to the Federal Election.

The Great Suburban Walk will take place in Melbourne in the electorates of Melbourne, La Trobe and Deakin. There will also be regional gatherings organised by local groups - for more information on these go to: www.walkagainstawarming.org.au

In each of these key electorates hundreds of Victorians will come together for a quick rally beginning at 12.30pm, calling for climate action. You will then be encouraged to help letterbox the electorates with maps in hand. You'll each get a designated area and mostly be walking in pairs or small groups. (You are encouraged to come up with a fun theme for your group to make the day extra colourful!)

The flyers that you'll be putting in the letterboxes will call on the Government to:

- Make the polluters pay by putting a price on carbon
- Replace our most pollution power stations like Hazelwood with clean energy
- Create new clean energy jobs and industries
- Guarantee to cut pollution over the next term of government
- Support poor and vulnerable countries to tackle the impacts of climate change and invest in sustainable development.
